Biodiesel has gained much attention in recent years due to its eco-friendly nature, non-toxic characteristics, Biodegradability and lower net carbon cycle compared to conventional diesel fuels. ESTIMATION OF BIOLOGICAL OXYGEN DEMAND FROM DIFFERENT WATER SAMPLES on Date: 03/01/2023.



Biochemical oxygen demand is the amount of oxygen consumed by bacteria and other microorganisms while they decompose organic matter under aerobic conditions. The common lake or stream contains small amounts of oxygen in the form of dissolved oxygen (DO). Dissolved oxygen is a crucial component of natural water bodies, maintaining the aquatic life and quality aesthetic of streams and lakes. The decay of organic matter in water is measured as biochemical oxygen demand. Environmental stresses and other human-induced factors can lessen the amount of dissolved oxygen in a water body. Biological oxygen demand is essentially a measure of the amount of oxygen required to remove waste organic matter from water in the process of decomposition by aerobic bacteria. To comply with BOD limits, commercial production and manufacturing industries are required to implement a wastewater pretreatment or disposal program.
